
Audacity – Recording with Audacity

Setup: Recording

- 1. Create a new project
 - In the menu bar at the top of the screen, select File > Save
 Project As
 - o Choose the location and a filename for your project.
 - When you start a new Audacity project, only the "Save Project As" menu option is available.



- 2. Check the Preferences
 - In the Audacity Mixer Toolbar, click on the drop down menu where it says "Internal Mic"



- Here you will select if you are using the "Internal Mic" or if you are connecting an "External Mic"
- 3. Once you have selected your mic option, you are ready to record
- 4. Click on the red **Record** button to begin recording
 - You may select:
 - o the blue **Pause** button to pause recording and then select it again to continue recording
 - the yellow Stop button to stop recording



Playback

The recorded file will be displayed in an audio track

Click on the green Play button at the top of the screen to hear your recorded audio file

Rules of Audacity

- 1. One clip per track
 - A clip is simply a piece of audio material
- 2. Audacity always records to a new track
 - This new track is opened at the bottom of the screen
- 3. Edit/Duplicate will not create a new audio file
 - Audacity will reference the original audio material until you actually perform some kind of edit (i.e., cut or effect)
 - Remember you can Undo/Redo as many times as you like even after you have saved the project
